Letter from the CEO

Dear Friends and Supporters,

At EmberHope Youthville, we believe that every child deserves hope, stability, and a future filled with possibility. As we close out Fiscal Year 2024, I am proud to reflect on a year marked by growth, vision, and mission-driven achievement. Together with the strength of our team, the guidance of our Board of Directors, and the support of our community, we have laid the necessary groundwork for the future while expanding our impact today.

One of our most significant accomplishments this year was the *successful development of a Campus Master Plan*, a collaborative effort between our leadership team and Board of Directors. This forward-looking plan positions us for long-term stability and growth. As part of this initiative, we prepared and applied to the Kansas Housing Resources Corporation (KHRC) for Low-Income Housing Tax Credits (LIHTC). This significant milestone culminated in a successful award in the spring of FY24. This funding will allow us to better serve youth and families in an intergenerational housing community on our campus, all while ensuring housing access, permanency, and support.

In line with our commitment to sustainability and service expansion, we substantially progressed in diversifying our funding sources. Notably, we were awarded a contract for Case Management Services. These awards enabled the foundation of our EmberHope Connections initiative to reach more than 1,300 children and families in Sedgwick County. In addition, EmberHope Youthville was honored to receive both a Therapeutic Family Foster Home Capacity Grant and a Functional Family Therapy program grant award through the Department for Children and Families, the latter specifically aimed to support children and families in Western KS. This growth represents a deepening of our mission to restore hope and ignite change for children and families in crisis.

FY24 also marked the *beginning of a new chapter*, as we, in partnership with our board, initiated the revitalization and rebranding of the EmberHope Foundation. This effort reflects our commitment to building long-term philanthropic support that aligns with the evolving needs of those we serve.

As we look ahead, I am energized by the momentum we have built and deeply grateful for your trust in us. Your support fuels our mission and empowers us to reach farther and serve more. Your generosity fuels everything we do; together, we can ensure that no child falls through the cracks.

"The event was a true delight, particularly because it allowed me to connect with other EmberHope foster parents face to face," shared Deborah Diggs, one of our dedicated foster parents.



Wichita Prayer Breakfast & Care for Every Family Launch

In 2024, EmberHope had the honor of attending the Wichita Prayer Breakfast, hosted by Lead Wichita, to celebrate the



launch of Care for Every Family—a powerful new community initiative focused on strengthening families and reducing the need for foster care in Sedgwick County. Keynote speaker Bishop W.C. Martin shared the moving story of how his small church in *Possum Trot, Texas, adopted 77 children* out of foster care—an inspiring testament of faith and action that will soon be featured in the upcoming film Possum Trot. EmberHope is proud to be an equipping partner in this effort, joining over a dozen local organizations and faith leaders united in support of children and families across our community.



Susan's Kids Bag Drive **Delivers Dignity and Hope**

EmberHope was blessed to be the recipient of the third annual Susan's Kids Bag Drive, and this year's effort was their biggest yet. With the help of generous donors across the region, their team collected and delivered an astounding 1,500 suitcases, backpacks, and duffle bags to our Newton campus which made this the largest drive to date.

While it may seem like a small gesture to some, to a foster child, *having a bag of their own* shows that they are cared for, respected, and gives them a heightened sense of pride and belonging. These bags represent more than just a way to carry their belongings—they symbolize dignity, stability, and hope.




Demographics of Youth Served

EmberHope served a total of 431 youth across all programs in FY24. We remain committed to providing inclusive, equitable care that reflects the diversity of the children and families we serve.

- 49% of youth identified as Caucasian/White
- 23% as Black or African American
- 16% as Hispanic or Latino
- The remaining 12% included youth identifying as Bi-Racial/Two or
- More Races, American Indian/Alaska Native, Asian, or Multi-Racial backgrounds
- Less than 1% identified as Black or African American/Hispanic or Latino
- 2% of responses were marked as Blank or Unavailable

This data reflects EmberHope's continued efforts to serve youth from a wide range of racial and ethnic backgrounds with culturally competent, trauma-informed care.



Volunteer Week Brings New Life to Our Goddard Campus

Each summer, EmberHope hosts a powerful Volunteer Week, aiming to bring volunteers together to assist with an array of campus projects. In June 2024, our Goddard campus was the main focus, where individuals and teams came together to support our mission in hands-on ways. This newly purchased property—*made possible with the* support of the Kansas Department for Aging and Disability Services (KDADS)—was acquired to serve youth who need a specialized level of care in a Secure Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facility (PRTF). From clearing overgrown trees to planting flowers and staining picnic tables, the transformation was remarkable—both physically and symbolically—showcasing the strength of community and the power of collective care.

A highlight of the week was the revitalization of the lake area, previously overgrown and inaccessible. Thanks to Leonard Mumford and his crew at Mumford Contracting, the space is now open and inviting for youth, staff, and guests. "As someone who was a troubled teen once, I fully understand the value these types of facilities bring," said Mumford.

"It was an honor to volunteer and support EmberHope's work."

"We want to say a huge thank you to all of the many volunteers who stepped up to help make this week so successful." said Tamber Rouse. Director of Donor Relations. "So many things have been accomplished, especially on our new Goddard campus. I'm always amazed at how volunteers come together, how much they accomplish, and how willing they are to give of themselves to help us."

Volunteer Week was about more than beautifying a campus—it was about *sowing seeds of hope and* opportunity. We are incredibly grateful to all the individuals, churches, organizations, and businesses who gave their time and energy.

Foster Care

Satisfaction Survey

Our bi-annual Foster Parent Survey *reflected a 96% satisfaction rate*, highlighting the value of consistent, responsive foster care workers and minimal turnover throughout the year. Foster parents expressed appreciation for staff availability and timely communication during critical incidents.

Customer satisfaction *reached 94%, surpassing our goal by 4%*. This achievement is largely credited to our dedicated Case Management Providers (CMPs) and our exceptional Intake and Admissions team, who serve as the welcoming first point of contact for many families and partner agencies.

Client satisfaction, measured through surveys with foster youth, *came in at 93%*, *also exceeding our goal*. Notably, 96% of youth reported feeling safe, having their needs met, and feeling cared for by their foster families. These results speak volumes about the quality of care provided by EmberHope foster families and the diligent staff who support them every step of the way.
